My name is Emma and I'm a new volunteer within our local Crohn's & Colitis UK Network.

I have such a passion for helping and supporting others that are on their own personal journey with inflammatory bowel disease.



One of the main reasons for me wanting to join the Organising Team was that I myself was diagnosed with Crohn's Disease over 20 years ago as a teenager.

It was a scary time and I definitely didn't have the support and knowledge I do now, especially from networks such as Crohn's & Colitis UK who I'll be forever grateful to.

I've been in and out of hospital since diagnosis including numerous operations and medications. In February this year I went through major life changing surgery of an ileostomy (stoma) and it's been a rollercoaster physically and emotionally.

Now I am a clinical nurse specialist, and I look after all children and young people with inflammatory bowel disease. I've been doing this job for 4 years now, it is my dream job and I love every moment.
