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Hi, I am Kerry, I have been an IBD nurse in Sheffield since 2003.

PERSONALISED CARE PLAN



PERSONALISED CARE PLAN - RESULTS FROM SURVEY


Thank you to everyone who has completed the survey so far! Here are some of our findings:

- 96% of respondents said they would like to have a personalised written care plan as part of their IBD care
- 91% of respondents said they would like the care plan to include an open text box to write about what matters to you at a particular point in time
- 99% of respondents said they would be happy to complete sections of their care plan before each consultation

I would like to have a personalised written care plan as part of my IBD care


Would you like the care plan to include an open text box to write about what matters to you at a particular point in time? 118 responses

goals) 119 responses




WHAT MATTERS TO YOU

We sent out some more letters recently, asking What Matters to You, and collect 199 responses.

Much like the first round, the themes that mattered most to people were:-

- Accessibility (52.8%)
- Communication (12.1%)
- Patient Centred Care (11.6%)

But this second round Quality (11.6%) was third most important.



We will be using these results to inform the changes we are making to the IBD services, thinking about areas such as:

- Improved IBD Nurse helplines
- Personalised care plans
- Increased awareness for Mental Health care
- whether appointments are face to face or over the telephone
