

# RICHARD "CHUBBY" AUGUSTUS FOOTBALL FUNDRAISER

In memory of local footballer, Richard "Chubby" Augustus, his family decided to host a football fundraiser. Chubby was diagnosed with Crohn's disease at just 16 and it was a battle he faced every day. He lived




with resilience, strength, and his signature sense of humour, refusing to let his condition stop him from making the most of life.

The fundraiser was held at his club CSKA Carnabys in Quorn, where past and present teammates took to the pitch for a fun day of football. There were tombolas, raffles and a visit from Leicester City Legend, Steve Walsh who made an appearance to chat to fans.

On the day our local Network held an awareness stand and had a great chat with so many people. Some sharing stories of Chubby and others wanting to know more about the charity and inflammatory bowel disease.

The Tombola raised £345 and the raffle, which finished a few days after the event, raised over £2000. There were donations totalling £908 collected at his funeral. Chubby's cousin raised over £1000 by bike-riding 300km around London. On the day the Leicestershire & Rutland Network collected £194 from collection tins placed

for university or travelling. Our guest speakers helped reduce the fear of these changes and helped show that a "normal" life can be lived and these exciting life changes should not be postponed or discouraged.

The IBD Nursing Team, Stoma Care Nurse and Gastroenterology Consultant, delivered an interesting talk, answering questions and even giving some time to more private chats with our quests.

Thank you to all of the Gastro Team and Crohn's & Colitis UK volunteers who gave up their time on a Saturday afternoon, for free to join us. It was great to see so many faces in our audience who all felt heard and had their concerns dealt with expertly.

# DEAF & BLIND SKYDIVE

A deaf and blind man from Derby, has skydived to raise money for Crohn's & Colitis UK.

Alec Creighton, who is having a cochlear implant fitted, was told he would not be able to skydive after the procedure, so completed the jump before his surgery.

He was raising money for Crohn's and Colitis UK due to his close link with the charity after he was

diagnosed with Crohn's disease in 2010.

The 38-year-old, who took part in the jump in Langar, Nottinghamshire, said: "I was nervous before. It was a shock because I can't see, so I was trying to imagine in my head."
