- Working with Crohn's & Colitis UK Local networks
- Promoting and being actively involved in campaigns including World IBD Day and Crohn's and Colitis Awareness Week.
- Respond to local requests for speaking/educational events

2. We want to support and empower people to be active participants in managing their life with Crohn's and Colitis

- Ensure every patient contact raises awareness of the charity
- Develop a good understanding of the information, support and membership offer Crohn's & Colitis UK provides and signpost patients to it
- Provide information packs to <u>all</u> patients in the IBD service, at any point in the IBD pathway
- Participate in Crohn's & Colitis UK projects and campaigns

3. We want high quality, sustainable care across the UK

- Work in partnership with individuals, families and carers using holistic needs assessments and personalised care planning
- Work with the IBD team to meet the IBD Standards and participate in IBD UK Benchmarking
- Create a culture of service development and innovation

- RGN
- Currently practicing as an IBD Nurse Specialist in the UK
- Evidence of current or potential advanced nursing practice e.g. running nurse led clinics, prescribing, making autonomous decisions about diagnosis, treatments or follow up
- Evidence of degree-level study and an education or mentorship nursing qualification
- Teaching and supervision of other nurses
- Knowledge of recent advances in clinical IBD management
- Proven communication skills and ability to negotiate
- Ability to problem solve and prioritise and to work to deadlines
- For RCN pathway, you must have an MSc in Nursing or Advanced Clinical Practice
