## **MEET ELENA**

Hi everyone,

I'm Elena, the Project Manager of AWARE-IBD. I have worked as a researcher at The University of Sheffield for almost four years, and have managed the AWARE-IBD project since we started in February 2020. I am proud to work with the project partners, including the Sheffield IBD Team, Crohn's & Colitis UK and our Patient Oversight Committee.



Involving people with Crohn's and Colitis is at the heart of the AWARE-IBD Project and enables us to make meaningful changes to the IBD service. I want to thank everyone for being involved so far - whether you're a research participant, part of our microsystem team or have provided feedback on the service change ideas. With your help, we've made great progress and we're now testing some of the service changes - which is so exciting! In November 2022 we trialled a new faceto-face clinic led by the IBD Nurse Specialists for patients receiving biologics infusions at the Royal Hallamshire Hospital. We also trialled a new IBD 'consultant of the day' clinic for patients who are newly diagnosed, have changed biologic treatments or require urgent clinical review due to a flare. We've designed a template for a personalised written care plan based on your feedback and will be testing this very soon! Finally, we're finalising our upskilling toolkit developed by people with IBD and VoiceAbility, which we'll be looking to share with you early next year. I am really excited to see what the final year of the project brings!

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## UPDATES

#### **PERSONALISED CARE PLAN**



As part of the AWARE-IBD Project, we are introducing written personalised care plans to improve the IBD service.

Since our last newsletter, we've done a survey and two workshops to decide on the content of the care plan and what would be most beneficial to you. We've now developed a template for the care plan, which you can view here:

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#### **NEW CLINCS**

To improve access to the IBD service, we introduced new face-to-face clinics at the Royal Hallamshire Hospital. The first clinic was led by IBD Nurse Specialists on the Clinical Investigations Unit for people who receive infusions as part of their IBD care. Those with an overdue 3-monthly review were invited to a clinic appointment in November 2022 on the same day as their infusion appointment.

The second clinic was led by IBD Consultants and was targeted at patients who are newly diagnosed, have changed biologic treatments or require urgent clinical review for flare symptoms following a call to the helpline. These new clinics were trialled over a period of 2–4 weeks in November 2022. We have collected patient and staff feedback on how the clinics went and will use this information to evaluate and reflect whether or not they improved the IBD service.
